Fall Enrollment:

The Board was provided an update on District fall enrollment numbers. Preliminary data indicates enrollment numbers for the 2019-20 school year will be similar to the 2018-19 school year.

BoE Professional Development (Nov. 7 & Mar. 19):

Based upon feedback from the WPS BoE last spring, professional learning topics were identified. The Board shared that they would appreciate learning around special education and curriculum. WPS Director of Student Services, Jason Maas, will lead the learning on November 7<sup>th</sup> and WPS Director of Teaching and Learning, Dr. Jennifer Slanger, will lead the session on March 19<sup>th</sup>.

Fall Athletic Participation Numbers:

WHS Athletic Director, Ted Hollern, provided the Board an update on fall athletic participation numbers. 197 Student athletes are participating in sports this fall. Administration will continue to track participation numbers over time.

Construction Update:

The Board was provided an update on current construction taking place across the District. The community is encouraged to visit the construction webcam link to view the current progress. The football field is complete and a final walkthrough of the athletic facilities will be scheduled in the near future. Excitement is building for the anticipated opening of the facility on October 11<sup>th</sup>.

2019 Wolf PAC (Professional & Authentic Collaboration):

2019 marked the 3<sup>rd</sup> year for Wolf PAC. Last Friday, August 23<sup>rd</sup>, 53 staff members presented on a wide variety of sessions. Those attending the sessions included teachers, paras, custodians, maintenance, bus drivers, teachers and administrators. Dr. Bill Pink, President of GRCC, got the day started by serving as our keynote speaker. We have received positive feedback from staff appreciating the format of learning and the session options. Multiple compliments were also received from outside presenters and guests who were in attendance that day.

Grand Rapids Community College Gear Up Grant: WJH was the host site for 48 students from Wyoming, Godwin, Godfrey Lee, and Kelloggsville. 16 of our current 8<sup>th</sup> graders are a part of this grant program which supports preparing them for college and career readiness. As part of this cohort, the students engaged in summer academic learning and will continue to be supported by a math tutor for three days after school. The program director shared that "WPS has a great capacity for work, has a sharp attention to detail and a welcoming "can-do" attitude."
