Active Reading



<u>DEFINITION of Active Reading</u> = Students visibly interacting with text to reflect their level of understanding.

<u>PURPOSE of Active Reading</u> = to help students and teachers identify immediate next steps in clarifying/defining/narrowing/etc. before moving on to tasks.

NEEDED: Students need a pencil or pen (not highlighter) to do the following:

STEPS in Active Reading:

- 1. (Circle) key terms, technical terms and/or verbs
- 2. Underline main idea, important information, key phrases, definitions
- 3. Question mark next to words/phrases you don't know
- 4. Write in the margin questions, summary statement, notes, thoughts, connections, predictions and/or draw pictures
- 5. Draw a box around transition words: first, second, however
- 6. OPTIONAL: Other symbols you may choose to use but are not required are double underline, check mark (identify factual details), star (topic sentence)

NOTES:

When students can't write in the textbook, you may want to use post-it notes.

Reading strategies include: Pre-reading; During reading (active reading); After reading
