Alpha Wolf 11 Champions of Character – Spring 2024:

WHS Principal Josh Baumbach and teacher John Doyle were in attendance on Monday (05/13/24) evening to share the Wyoming High School building spotlight presentation which recognized the newest Alpha Wolf 11 award recipients (Teagyn Ager, Tyson Evans, Gabriel Fischer, D'Leeth Gayot-Ramirez, Chesson Oliver, LaNieva Raybon, Mauricio Hernandez-Key, Isaac Zavala-Pantoja). These scholars were recently selected by staff and peers at Wyoming High School as Alpha Wolf 11 Champions of Character for displaying kindness, compassion, and gratitude in all that they do.

Superintendent Hoekstra thanked the parents and families in attendance for raising such wonderful human beings. He also recognized the scholars for their character noting that the traits they are being recognized for will carry with they beyond the walls of Wyoming High School. He also thanked Mr. Baumbach and Mr. Doyle for their continued commitment to the program and its success.

Mr. Doyle explained to those in attendance that the celebrations have evolved and that more and more student voices are a part of the ceremony. The theme for this semester's presentation was PEACE (Patient, Empathetic, Appreciative, Courageous, Encouraging).

Teagyn Ager said that being recognized as an Alpha Wolf 11 means a lot to her personally. She said it was nice to be noticed for being kind and making a difference within the school community.

Tyson Evans spoke about the shock and excitement he felt when his name was called. He said he didn't expect to win and it made him realize how little things can impact others.

Gabriel Fischer said that winning the Alpha Wolf 11 Award was special because it was about getting recognized for your character. He said he is a quiet person but works hard to be kind and lead in his classes.

D'Leeth Gayot-Ramirez said winning the award means a lot to her and her family. She is quiet by nature but has tried to go out of her way to be kind and meet other people outside of her friend group. She feels proud of herself and winning the award has motivated her to be even more involved in the school community.

Chesson Oliver was surprised to win the award and learn she was having an effect on the school culture. She mentioned that she has friends in other districts who are having a very different high school experience. She values attending WHS and the AW11 culture in the building.

Building Spotlight Presentation – Gladiola Elementary:

Gladiola Elementary Principal, Dana Stein, shared a video with the Board which provided an overview of their building theme "All Are Welcome" and what it means to be a leader of the pack. Scholars used their voices to explain to the group what it personally means to be recognized as a leader in their school community.

Building Spotlight Presentation – West Elementary:

Following the committee meeting, members of the Board traveled to West Elementary School where they were greeted by Principal Brian Hartigan and welcomed to the West Multicultural Night. West staff invited families to travel the countries of our community through fun, interactive, and family focused events, music, arts, and crafts. Those in attendance were also invited to take home a community cookbook created by staff and student families.

Staffing Update:

Matt Lewis, Associate Superintendent, and Jodi Goff, Interim Director of Human Resources, provided the Board a staffing update.

KIASB Ballot & Election Resolution: **Action Item – Approved** The Board was presented with a Kent Intermediate Association of School Boards (KIASB) ballot for review, consideration, and recommendation.

There are currently three KIASB seats with terms expiring on June 30, 2024. The WPS Board of Education was asked by the ISD to select three (3) candidates from the following list to fill the soon to be vacated seats:

- Christie Ramsey (Rockford Region 1)
- Teresa Ramirez (Northview Region 1)
- Ken Hornecker (Godwin Heights Region 3- Incumbent)

The Board selected Ramsey, Ramirez, and Hornecker as the three candidates to fill the vacant seats.

Alternative Education Update:

The Board was provided an update on the Wyoming Secondary Learning Academy (SLA) which is set to launch in the 2024-25 school year. The SLA will be tailored for students in grades 7-12 who need an alternative educational experience. The program will be grounded in three guiding principles: community-centered, competency-based, and career-focused.

Delaporte Lynch: **Action Item – Approved** The Board reviewed and approved the request to add Delaporte Lynch to the list of approved District law firm partners.

School Tax Collection Agreement: **Action Item – Approved** The Board reviewed and approved the school tax collection agreement provided by the City of Wyoming. The agreement will take effect July 1, 2024.

WIS & WJH Security Camera Purchase:

Action Item – Approved

The Board reviewed and approved the SyncWave project overview and quote in the amount of \$131,015.48, utilizing PEPPM consortium pricing. Approval of this project will result in the purchase of 104 Hanwha camera units to be used at Wyoming Junior High School (WJH) and Wyoming Intermediate School (WIS). As part of the project, a new server would also be installed at WIS in the main distribution frame to handle the Wisenet WAVE software as the video management software for the Hanwha cameras.

Sinking Fund Budget Amendment: **Action Item – Approved**

The Board reviewed and approved the sinking fund budget amendment as presented.

2024-25 Kent ISD Budget: **Action Item – Approved**

The Board reviewed and approved a partnership proposal between the District and Graduation Alliance, Inc. This partnership would support scholars who have been expelled, dropped out, are at risk of dropping out, and/or other provisions and circumstances outlined in legislation. Graduation Alliance has a proven track record of supporting districts' administration of a Dropout and Recovery Program. As a District, we must pursue multiple avenues to ensure all scholars receive their high school diploma. This partnership would add another option beyond our traditional high school and alternative education program.
